

The Conditional Tenses

- Decide whether each of these sentences are in the 'Zero', 'First', 'Second' or 'Third' Conditional.

Q1. If I went to the cinema, I would see that film.

Q2. If I had eaten dinner, I wouldn't have been so hungry afterwards.

Q3. If I go to the beach, I will swim in the sea.

Q4. If you go outside, don't forget to close the door behind you.

Q5. If the postman arrives, ask him about that letter.
